



- Where does this USDA program come from?
 - In 1988, Congress authorized USDA to develop Certified State Farm Mediation Programs
 - Mediation programs assist agricultural producers, their creditors and various USDA agencies in addressing loan problems, USDA adverse decisions, and other disputes.



History of the PA Ag Mediation Program

2012: USDA certified the 2012: USDA certified the Agricultural Agricultural (PAMP) Pennsylvania Agricultural (PAMP) Pennsylvania Program (PAMP) Mediation Program (PAMP)

2012-2017: the PA Dept of Ag operated PAMP

2018: Penn State Law took over operation of PAMP









Pa Agricultural Mediation Program

USDA-related issues:

- Agricultural Loans
- Wetlands determinations
- Compliance with farm programs, including conservation programs
- National organic program
- Agricultural Credit
- Rural water loan programs
- Grazing on National Forest System land
- Pesticides



Pa Agricultural Mediation Program

Non-USDA issues:

- Lease issues; including land leases and equipment leases.
- Family farm transition.
- Farmer-neighbor disputes



What does this process look like?

- 1. Producer contacts the PAMP Program Coordinator to initiate the process
- 2. Parties agree to participate
- 3. Mediator and program coordinator gather facts for a mediation meeting
- 4. Mediator evaluates the mediation information & holds mediation session
- 5. Mediation agreement is executed



- Why should I consider mediation?
 - Preserves relationships
 - Prevent future disputes
 - Save money (Avoid lawsuits)



- How much does mediation cost?
 - Currently free
- Who conducts mediation?
 - Impartial 3rd party mediator
- Where are mediations held?
 - Currently via Zoom (normally in-person)
- If an agreement is not reached, the requestor may still seek legal action
