2	independent administrative commission known as the Pennsylvania
3	Game Commission shall consist of nine competent citizens of this
4	Commonwealth who shall be well informed on the subject of
5	wildlife conservation and restoration and who shall be appointed
6	by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of a
7	majority of the elected members of the Senate.

9	(b.1) Additional consideration. The Governor shall ensure
10	that at least one member of the commission represents the
11	interest of agricultural commodities that pertain to normal
12	agricultural operations and wildlife.

15 Any person who kills any game or wildlife, other than 16 raccoons, under the provisions of this subchapter shall, within-24 hours, report, orally or in writing, the killing to an-17 18 officer of the commission. The report shall set forth the date, 19 time and place of the killing, the number of species killed 20 [and], the sex of the species[.] and the location of each carcass. The commission shall establish a self-reporting system 21 that allows a person assigned to remove deer for crop damage 22 23 purposes to report each harvest to an officer of the commission 24 via a toll free telephone number, online application or publicly 25 accessible Internet website. 26 <u>\$ 2125. 24	authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner
25	prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
26	person's attention [or is fenced or enclosed in a manner
27	manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or];
28	(2) enters or remains on any land of another without
29	authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave
30	that has been personally communicated to the person by the

1 owner of the land or other authorized person[.];
